## Malicious Destruction of Property

On May 13, 2014 at 5:30 PM a subject came into the police station to report that he believed his vehicle was struck with bullets while it was parked overnight on Gray Court in Milan the previous evening.

The complainant, who is in his mid-twenties from Milan, advised that he parked his pick-up on the street at approximately 9:00 PM on Monday, May 12, 2014. He stated he entered the vehicle at 11:30 AM the next morning and did not notice anything out of the ordinary. He stated he drove out of the city and later while driving, the vehicle began to overheat. When he stopped to investigate, he observed several holes in the front of the truck, including the radiator. He had the vehicle towed to a shop and returned home where he discovered what appeared to be bullet fragments and small pieces of plastic from the vehicle lying on the street where it had been parked. He collected those and brought them with him to the police department.

The street in question is a dead end that connects to Kay Street which leads into the sub-division. The investigating officer went to the location and did not locate any additional debris on the street. He spoke to several neighbors who reported they did not hear anything suspicious overnight. One subject in the general vicinity reported hearing noises around 3:00 AM that could have been gun shots, however did not observe any vehicles or persons out on foot in the general vicinity at the time. There were numerous cars parked along Kay Street and in the immediate and surrounding area that were not damaged. No residences in the area were damaged. The investigating officer will be conducting additional neighbor canvasses today. The vehicle was already in the shop at the time the subject made this report. The investigating officer was able to contact the shop and arranged for the vehicle to be secured so he could inspect it and recover any additional evidence. The subject who reported the incident reported he was not having any issues or disputes with anyone.

Officers are conducting extra patrols in and around the area. No similar incidents have occurred in Milan, nor are we aware of any that have been reported in the area. The bullet fragments that were turned over to the police department by the complainant appear to be of a smaller caliber. Anyone with any information regarding this incident or who may have heard or observed anything suspicious, including suspicious persons or vehicles in the area during the above time frame, is asked to contact the police department.
